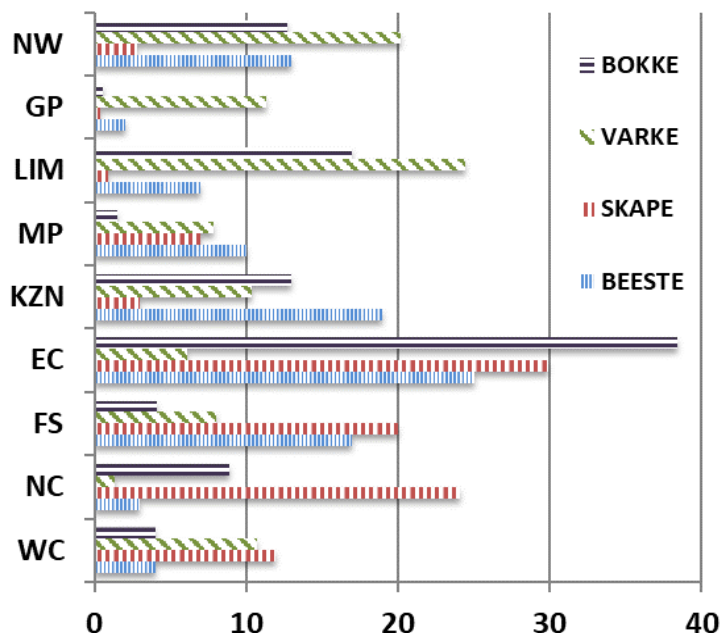

PERSENTASIE



BEESTE: Die meeste beeste word in die Oos-Kaap aangetref, gevolg deur KwaZulu-Natal en dan die Vrystaat.

SKAAP: Die hoogste getal skaap word in die Oos-Kaap gevind, gevolg deur die Noord-Kaap en dan die Vrystaat.

VARKE: Die meeste varke word in Limpopo aangetref, gevolg deur Noordwes en dan die Gauteng and Wes-Kaap.

BOKKE: Oos-Kaap het die meeste aantal bokke, gevolg deur onderskeidelik Limpopo en KwaZulu-Natal.

NOTAS (SEP – NOV 2019)

Reënval: Die land het gedurende die periode gemiddeld onder normale reënval ontvang, met berig oorstromings, storms en hewige winde in KwaZulu-Natal.

Vee: Die kondisie vir vee was swak tot redelik gedurende die verslagperiode. OK-gevalle van bosluisoordraagbare siektes; KZN het verliese gerapporteer weens 'n gebrek aan water, vuurstorms en kwart-kwaad-siekte; LIP het gevalle van F&M aangemeld, terwyl Mpumalanga Afrika-varkkoors aangemeld het.

Weiding/Veld: Met onder normale reënval was die veldtoestande gemiddeld swak tot redelik. FS, KZN en LIM het gedurende die tydperk gevalle van veldbrande ervaar.

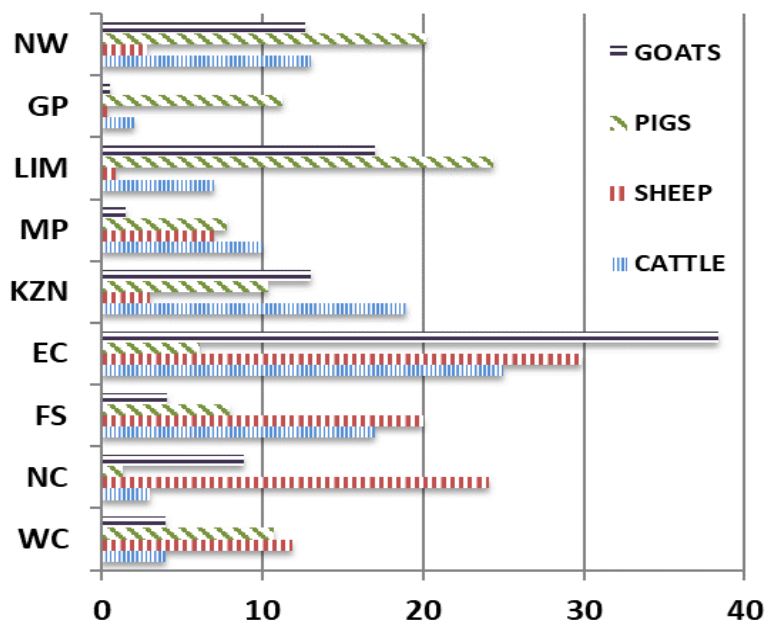

The numbers for cattle, sheep, pigs and goats decreased by approximately 0.42%, 0.78%, 0.14% and 0.65% respectively between August 2019 and November 2019.

PERCENTAGES



CATTLE: Eastern Cape has the highest percentage of Cattle, followed by KwaZulu-Natal and Free State.

SHEEP: The highest percentage of sheep is in Eastern Cape, followed by Northern Cape and Free State.

PIGS: Pigs are largely in Limpopo, followed by North West, Gauteng and Western Cape.

GOATS: Eastern Cape has the highest number of goats, with Limpopo and KwaZulu-Natal following respectively.

NOTES (SEP – NOV 2019)

Rain: The country received, on average, below normal rainfall during this period, with reported flooding, storms and heavy winds in KwaZulu-Natal.

Livestock: The condition for livestock was poor to reasonable over the period in report. EC reported cases of tick-borne diseases; KZN reported losses due to lack of water, firestorms and Quarter Evil disease; LIP reported cases of F&M, while Mpumalanga reported African swine fever.

Pasture/veld: With below normal rainfall, veld conditions were poor to reasonable on average. FS, KZN and LIM experienced cases of veld fires over the period.
